The Beach Shack, "Home of the Pink Golf Carts", has stepped up to offer a courtesy golf cart shuttle service Friday-Sunday (schedule subject to change based on demand and weather conditions). Protecting the West End This Summer Summer is in full swing, and Dauphin Island's West End Nature Preserve remains a peaceful escape for visitors—and a vital habitat for endangered sea turtles, migratory birds, and other wildlife. If you're heading out to the West End, please take a few simple precautions: Stay near the shoreline, Avoid dunes and marked nesting areas, Leave pets at home, Pick up all trash, Keep lights and noise low. Boaters: Please avoid anchoring in seagrass beds, and be mindful of your wake near sensitive areas. Together, we can keep the West End safe, clean, and thriving for wildlife and for future visitors.

Pre-Storm Planning The Town of Dauphin Island is always looking for new ways to improve on our existing pre and post-disaster planning and implementation measures that can help reduce damage and shorten recovery periods. While much of the attention is focused on town readiness, we are also taking steps to inform and empower property owners as well to lessen the stress and inconvenience that can accompany these difficult times. For example, the town is developing a contact list containing a variety of services (ex. Electricians, Contractors, Plumbers, Tree Trimmers, etc.) to share with our property owners that are often in high demand immediately after a storm or hurricane. In addition, we are also creating an inventory of active insurance carriers that service the island including adjusters and more. Having this information in hand prior to an actual event should prove extremely beneficial. Note: Property owners are NOT required to use contractors from the list. However, all contractors MUST be licensed to do business on the island.

One Year Later - the East End Beach and Dune Restoration Project It has been a year since the construction of the East End project and the "Year 1" monitoring results are in and all positive! Sand pumping ended in late March 2024 and all the vegetation plantings with sand fences were completed by August 2024. The Town has a formal, scientific monitoring program for the Project as part of the beach management plan. The "Year 1" results all indicate the project is performing very well. In fact, there was less movement of the new sand than was predicted in the design phase! About 92% of the 1.1 million cubic yards of new sand placed in early 2024 is still on the beach in the original project limits. Most of the remaining 8% is on the beaches to the immediate west of the project limits (west side of the DeSoto Landing neighborhood beaches). Almost all of the 700,000 plants (mostly sea oats) are alive, and, indeed, thriving. The small, hummocky sand dunes constructed behind the wide beach south of the Audubon bird sanctuary are growing due to wind-blown sand, particularly where sand fencing was placed. Detailed scientific measurements of the new beach indicate that the new sand is soft enough for sea turtle nesting should some try to nest there this summer. The primary reason is that the new sand was almost a perfect match, in terms of sand grain size distribution and content, with the native beach sands. The new sand beach was widened 300-400 feet during construction in 2024, and, a year later, the average width is about 25 feet less than the constructed width. The "Year 1" changes in beach width at both the west end of the project (basically in front of the condominiums) and at the east end of the project (the curved pocket beaches near the rock breakwaters southwest of Fort Gaines) are significantly less than were predicted in the design phase. This was due to relatively mild wave conditions (no hurricanes!) and some natural changes in Pelican Peninsula. Overall, the East End project looks great and is being used daily by residents, visitors and wildlife of all kinds. Some photos of the new beach and some of these monitoring results are summarized in a slide presentation that is on the Town's website.

Aloe Bay Harbor Town Update The town was awarded a RESTORE Grant of \$16M+ through the Alabama Gulf Coast Recovery Council to support the island's economy and fiscal sustainability and the initial construction consisting of a new seawall and boardwalk facility will get underway later this year. Specifically, this site is between the Putt-Putt and Patronas Park along Desoto Avenue. Additional planned work will include enhanced streetscape and other related improvements.



"Back to School Sales Tax Holiday" While students have only recently finished the 2024-25 school year, state officials are already reminding parents of the annual Sales Tax Holiday that runs from July 18-20 this year. During this time, certain non-commercial purchases related to school clothing and a host of other supplies are exempt from state sales and use tax. Backyard Citrus Tree Care Caring for backyard citrus trees on Dauphin Island is a rewarding endeavor, and Alabama Extension is here to help residents get the most out of their trees. Citrus trees like satsumas, lemons, and kumquats thrive in our coastal climate, but they still require proper care to stay healthy and productive. Common issues such as yellowing leaves, fruit drop, or twig dieback can often be signs of disease, nutritional deficiencies, or environmental stress. Alabama Extension provides a wide range of research-based resources to assist homeowners in identifying and treating these problems. You can visit www.aces.edu to find publications on citrus fertilization, pruning, pest management, and seasonal care. The website also offers guidance on how to submit plant samples if you suspect your citrus tree may be suffering from a disease and also soil testing information. Early diagnosis can make all the difference in restoring a tree's health and productivity. To further support the community, Alabama Extension is partnering with the Town of Dauphin Island to plan a Homeowner Citrus Workshop this fall. This event will provide expert advice tailored to our local growing conditions. Topics will include selecting the right citrus varieties, managing cold protection, understanding pest and disease threats, and improving soil health around your trees. Whether you're new to citrus or have been growing it for years, the workshop will offer something for everyone. Be on the lookout for announcements about the date and location as details are finalized. Alabama Extension is proud to support the residents of Dauphin Island in growing strong, healthy citrus trees right in their own backyards.
