TOWN COUNCIL MEETING  
NOVEMBER 15, 2022

The Town of Dauphin Island Town Council met in regular session at 6:00 pm on November 15, 2022 in the Council Chambers. Attorney Bob Campbell was in attendance via phone. ZOOM and FACEBOOK were utilized to allow residents and other interested parties to safely participate.

Mayor Jeff Collier called the Council Meeting to order and invited all present to stand and repeat in unison the Lord's Prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States. Town Clerk Wanda Sandagger called roll. A record of the results is as follows:

A quorum having been achieved, action was taken on the following topics.

**ADOPT PRELIMINARY AGENDA:**

Trey Alderman made a motion to add two items and approve the Preliminary Agenda for November 15, 2022 as the Official Agenda. Gene Fox seconded and the motion was approved unanimously.

A motion was made by Trey Alderman to approve the Regular meeting minutes for November 1, 2022. Rich Colberg seconded and the motion passed.

A motion was made by Rich Colberg and seconded by Earle Connell to approve the invoices over \$1,000.00 as submitted. The motion carried unanimously.

NEW BUSINESS #1: PARKS & RECREATION BOARDWALKS

Trey Alderman made a motion to repair boardwalks from campground to the beach and the handicap ramp to the restroom with a cost up to \$9,000. Rich Colberg seconded and the motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS #2: STORMWATER DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENTS

Gene Fox made a motion to approve grant match of \$46,830 for the Dauphin Island Stormwater Masterplan and Drainage Improvements (east of Salt Creek to east of Bird Sanctuary). Rich Colberg seconded and the motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS #3: COASTAL DUNE RESTORATION EXPERIMENT

A motion was made by Gene Fox to approve the restoration experiment on the east end proposed by Jeremiah Henning, University of South Alabama. Trey Alderman seconded and the motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS #4: CADILLAC SQUARE RESTROOM

A motion was made by Trey Alderman to approve a pre-cast concrete flood proof restroom at Cadillac Square. Gene Fox seconded and the motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS #5: EAST END BEACH WATER/SEWER SERVICE

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A motion was made by Trey Alderman and seconded by Rich Colberg to approve Task 1 with the cost of \$25,000.00 for Engineering Design proposed by Ardurra for the East End Public Beach Water & Sewer project. Water and Sewer will oversee the project and Public Works will complete the job. Project will be paid for with AARPA funds. The motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS #6: POLICE DEPARTMENT PAY ADJUSTMENTS

Trey Alderman made a motion to approve the following pay adjustments; William Brown to \$14.00 per hour, Miranda Lee \$14.00 per hour beginning the first day of the next pay period, and Jessica Hope \$14.00 beginning the first day of the pay period after probation. Gene Fox seconded and the motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS #7: PD HIRE FULL TIME OFFICER

Gene Fox made a motion to authorize Chief Claw to hire a fulltime Police Officer. Trey Alderman seconded and the motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS #8: PUBLIC WORKS REPAIRS TO KAWASKI MULE

Clinton Collier made a motion to reject the repairs to the Kawasaki mule and to purchase a new UTV up to \$10,000. Earle Connell seconded and the motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS #9: GILLIS CONSTRUCTION – DESOTO BOAT RAMP

A motion was made by Gene Fox to approve the invoice of \$505,517.83 from Gillis Construction for the DeSoto Boat Ramp project. Trey Alderman seconded and the motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS #10: BLADE CONSTRUCTION - LBGH

Gene Fox made a motion to approve the invoice of \$49,808.90 from Blade Construction for Little Billy Goat Hole Marine improvements. Trey Alderman seconded and the motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS #11: WORKSHOP MEETINGS

Earle Connell made a motion to approve Town Council workshop meetings on November 21st, November 28<sup>th</sup> and December 1<sup>st</sup> at 1:00 pm to discuss zoning ordinance changes.

NEW BUSINESS #12: ALOE BAY LOAN RENEWAL - REFINANCE

Rich Colberg made a motion to approve Community Bank proposal to refinance the Aloe Bay Loan at five percent (5%). Earle Connell seconded and the motion passed.



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
