Dauphin Island Causeway Placement of dredged material ongoing: The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) Mobile District has partnered with Mobile County to provide material for the Dauphin Island Causeway as part of the Mobile Harbor Deepening and Widening (Phase 6) project. In March 2025, the USACE contractor began placing dredged material behind the breakwaters constructed by Mobile County's contractor. Approximately 800,000 cubic yards of dredged material will be placed to create approximately 80 acres of marsh habitat and further protect the Causeway. Placement at the Dauphin Island Causeway should be completed early Summer 2025. Visit Mobile County's website for additional information: https://www.mobilecountyal.gov/dauphin-island-causeway/.

Sand Island Beneficial Use NW Extension Placement Placement of dredged material starting soon: The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) Mobile District will be beneficially placing sand within the Sand Island Beneficial Use NW extension. Sand will be placed along the ebbtidal delta shoal system southeast of Pelican Island as part of the Mobile Harbor Deepening and Widening (Phase 2a) project. Approximately 2.6 million cubic yards of material will be placed to a maximum elevation of +4 feet. Some areas may be constructed higher temporarily to allow for construction staging. Construction is anticipated to begin May 2025. Construction is anticipated to be complete in July 2025.

Share the Beach The 2025 nesting season officially starts May 1! You will see our volunteers out patrolling our beaches every morning. Please be sure to say hello and ask any questions if you see them! Also, please remember to fill any holes back in, remove all beach gear and equipment at the end of your beach day, and keep it dark at night. Use turtle friendly flashlights and house lights. We will be holding our first Dauphin Island Share the Beach Turtle Jamboree on Thursday, May 29, at Pirate's Bar and Grill. It will be held from 5 - 8 pm. Congressman Barry Moore Offers Public Assistance The Town of Dauphin Island recently partnered with Congressman Barry Moore's office to provide in-person assistance at town hall on the second Tuesday of each month from 9am-11am. A representative will be on hand to help citizens with federal agency issues related to IRS, SSA, VA, Passports, etc. and no appointment necessary. This new service starts on Tuesday, May 13 and continue throughout 2025.

We'll Cross That Bridge... You may have read recently that ALDOT has awarded a \$33 million contract for repairs to the Dauphin Island Bridge. This work is expected to extend over a 3-5 year period and focus primarily on the high rise section that spans the Intracoastal Waterway (ICW). During this time motorists should expect lane closures so plan your travels accordingly. Town representatives will attend a pre-construction meeting at the ALDOT office in May and we will pass along any pertinent information.

Stay In Your Lane Surely you've noticed by now the new striping along Bienville Boulevard east of the 3-way stop. What a difference a fresh coat of paint makes! Over time the lines had faded and were somewhat difficult to see during certain weather conditions and the town saw fit to hire a local contractor to make the very noticeable improvements. Now that work is completed on Bienville east we're actually getting a quote to paint the lines on Bienville west of the 3-way. Our work is never done!

Public Beach Parking Info The weather is warming up and crowds are increasing at the town's three public beaches; East End, Middle (next to DI School), and West End. Daily fee is \$10 per vehicle (no charge for occupants) and the vehicle is allowed to visit one, two, or all three beaches during the same calendar day at no extra charge. The town has contracted with ParkMobile to make your next visit an easy and convenient one. Illegally parked vehicles will be subject to fines, booting, and/or towing. Annual passes for non-residents are available once again for \$150. Dauphin Island residents and property owners can purchase parking decals for \$5 each. Contact town hall for additional information.

West End Restoration Re-vote You should have recently received a ballot from the Dauphin Island Property Owners' Association that is critically important to the ongoing effort to construct an engineered beach along the west end of the island. The question on the ballot (in addition to the annual election of officers) is quite simple. Do you support placing an easement on the DIPOA West Surf Beach to aid the town in securing a beach nourishment project? The easement would not change ownership of the property nor will it add to or alter the established DIPOA West Surf Beach access points. It would, however, allow the town to place sand along this stretch of heavily eroded shoreline, utilize construction equipment to perform such work, and maintain the project in perpetuity. Now here's the not-so-simple part. DIPOA ballots of this nature require a minimum total of 750 votes by property owners and at least 2/3 of those votes must be in the affirmative in order for the measure to pass. Therefore, it is imperative that you vote "YES" on this matter or the opportunity for a restoration project as currently planned will NOT move forward. You may recall a similar vote was taken earlier this year which passed 229-29. However, several property owners have challenged the ballot process and the DIPOA Board of Directors opted to call for this "second vote" on the issue to address those concerns. Remember, ballots are due May 10! Thanks in advance for your support!

Aloe Bay Harbor Town Update Island officials recently received notice from the ADCNR and U.S. Treasury to proceed with this long-awaited project along Desoto Avenue west of LeMoyne Drive. Bid documents are being drafted for the initial stages of construction that will include a new seawall, elevated boardwalk, utilities infrastructure upgrades, and streetscape improvements. The Aloe Bay Town Center Master Plan was completed in and adopted by the Town Council in 2021 following multiple public engagement opportunities. The overall vision is to create a walkable "downtown" area complete with shops, eateries, lodging, and more that compliment the existing business model while embracing our rich and vibrant natural resources.

Billy Goat Hole Update At the time of this news all of the docks and ramps have been removed and the old concrete will be repurposed as fill material in the construction of the new ramps. The contractor should complete the installation of the bulkhead within the next week and begin installation of pilings for the new finger piers. Currently, the projected completion date is mid-June. In the meantime, you should soon begin to see some activity related to the installation of a new elevator and ADA access ramp for the concession stand and restrooms during the month of May. We appreciate your continued patience as this project moves forward.

From the Desk of the Fire Chief As summer approaches and the island gets busier please remember...patience is a virtue! Be mindful that more children, pedestrians, and golf carts will be present on area streets and the bike trail and to always drive with caution. By the way, did you know that vehicle laws are the same for golf carts, including car seats? If you need help sizing and/or installing a car seat simply stop by the fire station from 9am-noon on May 3, 17, or 31 and someone will be on hand to assist you FREE of charge. Monitor rip current flags, the DI App, and the Public Safety Facebook page for changing conditions and always equip kids and less skilled swimmers with life jackets to enhance safety. If caught in a rip current be sure to swim parallel to the shoreline to get free from the rip current and then return to shore. The next DI Fire & Rescue meeting will be held on May 19 at 7pm and training nights are set for May 1, 15, & 29 at 6pm. Municipal Elections Reminder Dauphin Island voters will head to the polls on August 26 to elect a Mayor and five Council Members. Any required run-offs will take place on September 23. Individuals interested in registering as a candidate must do so with the Town Clerk June 10-24. 2025 to be on the ballot. May 28 is the last day a person can become a resident of the municipality in order to become a candidate. Political signs may be posted on private property (See Zoning Ordinance; Article 9 Sign Regulations for details) beginning July 13. Additional info will be provided as the election draws near.

Town Purchases Boom Mower Our Public Works Dept. has a brand new piece of equipment to help maintain ditches and hard-to-reach places along island roadways. The combination tractor and boom mower is already in use and should help to eliminate blind corners and keep our right-of-ways looking sharp throughout the growing season. The mower is maneuverable and can also be used to trim small branches and other low hanging vegetation along the bike trail and area roadways.

West End Nature Preserve It's nearly 10 miles from the west end of Bienville Blvd. to the westernmost tip of the island. All 800+ acres now belong to the Town of Dauphin Island and includes a Conservation Management Plan to support and enhance bird (and turtle) nesting habitat throughout this unspoiled stretch of barrier island. A new Beach Ambassador program was created (and currently funded through a grant) to monitor and maintain the area going forward. Soon interpretive signage will be in place to protect critical nesting sites and remind beachgoers how to enjoy the island's natural beauty while doing so in a responsible and respectful manner. This will include avoiding active nesting sites, dune fields, and other vegetated areas, remove any trash/litter, and leave pets at home as dogs are prohibited on the west end. Together we can make sure this unique part of our barrier island community will continue to serve as a special place for both humans and animals to coexist in a productive and sustainable manner.
