Draft Zoning Ordinance Update, Public Hearing Set It has taken some time but the latest draft of the Zoning Ordinance was advertised to the public as of August 17 in preparation for the Public Hearing scheduled for October 4, 2023 at 5pm at Shelby Hall (DI Sea Lab). At first glance the document will appear larger than the previous version and that's because items stricken from the text currently remain to highlight specific changes that were made during the Town Council review process. Once adopted those items will be deleted leaving a slightly thinner finished product. In addition, new and/or added text will also appear in red print to aid the reader in identifying these most recent edits. We hope you will take time to familiarize yourself with the draft Zoning Ordinance in advance of the Public Hearing. We look forward to your collective input.

Sea Lab Tidbits The DI Sea Lab Foundation will host the Eleventh Annual Marine Environmental Awards Luncheon on Wednesday, October 25, 2023, from 11:30am-1pm at the Riverview Plaza Hotel. This will be a wonderful luncheon featuring keynote speaker Dr. Charlie Rolsky. Awards will also be presented to John Shell and the Downtown Mobile Alliance, who have made outstanding contributions to marine environmental sustainability in the Alabama Gulf Coast Region. Public Beach Parking Changes Coming The town has been in discussions with ParkMobile for about a year and recently contracted with the company to provide service for the town's three public beaches (East End, Middle & West End). The plan is to initiate the widely used Parking Payment System later this fall/winter to allow users ample opportunity to familiarize themselves with the new program in advance of the busy spring and summer seasons. The system affords multiple self-payment methods that are both easy and convenient. Informational signage will be placed at each parking lot location to ensure proper compliance. Dauphin Island residents/property owners with appropriate parking decals will continue to enjoy free parking in these areas.

Island Projects Update (1) The East End Beach & Dune Restoration Project team has finalized engineering plans and all permits are in hand to place more than 1 million cubic yards of sand along approximately 1 1/2 miles of shoreline. The town successfully secured funding for full construction from the National Fish & Wildlife Foundation (NFWF) Gulf Environmental Benefit Fund and the NFWF National Coastal Resilience Fund. Work is expected to begin in late 2023 and extend into the first quarter of 2024(+/-). (2) The town also secured funding from GOMESA and NFWF ECRF to design, permit, and construct two living shorelines in Aloe Bay; one adjacent to the wastewater treatment facility and future ecotourism site and the another will be between the new Desoto Avenue Boat Launch and the DI Airport. A permit application was submitted to the Corps and full design deliverables will be completed by December 2023. (3) The town continues to work with its engineering team to design alternatives to nourish/restore the west end of the island. The entire process could take several years to design, engineer, permit, and secure construction funding. Coastal change and modeling tasks have been completed and field investigations are underway including survey, geotechnical investigations, and cultural resource assessments. (4) Repairs to the East End Pier should be completed by November 2023 while repairs to the Middle Beach Pier are currently out for bid.

Bumpity, Bump Those routinely traveling westbound across Salt Creek Bridge have probably noticed a pronounced bump at the transition area where the Bienville Blvd. asphalt meets the concrete bridge slab. Recently, the town hired a local contractor to make repairs and the ride is now a smoother one. Yes, we were tempted to have the same contractor make similar repairs at the north end of the DI Bridge but that is the responsibility/jurisdiction of ALDOT. We've notified the agency multiple times about that significant bump but officials tell us it has not reached the stage that repairs are necessary. We'll stay on that issue.

Two New APPs Available The town App is now available! Please download it for FREE to stay informed on events, meetings, updated emergency information and all things Dauphin Island! Mobile County now has a new mobile alert system as well! By texting MOBILEALERT to 226787 anyone can register to receive information, emergency alerts or other important messages.

Parking Permit Requirements The Town issues permanent and temporary parking permits at the Police Department at no cost to eligible applicants. Permanent stickers (affixed to rear window of vehicle) are issued to island property owners only and requires one or more of the following items: Valid driver's license, vehicle registration, current utility bill (water or electric), and proof of residency (property deed or current paid property tax receipt). Permanent stickers for company-owned vehicles are only issued to the actual company owner. Similar documentation must be provided for all new issues and replacements. A limit of two permanent passes are available per household and offer free admission to town-owned public beaches. Temporary parking permits (placards to be placed on driver side dash) are available to guests/visitors of property owners and require the following items: Valid driver's license, vehicle registration, rental/lease agreement or statement from host property owner. Temporary passes are issued for the planned duration of the visit only, provide access to permit parking areas on four court streets along Bienville Boulevard west, but do not provide free access to town-owned beaches. In order to expedite the permit process we strongly recommend you have all required documents in hand prior to arrival. Applications can also be submitted via email to ppereida@townofdauphinisland.org. We greatly appreciate your cooperation & understanding in this matter.

Post-storm Building Repair Process Although the 2023 hurricane season should be winding down soon, property owners are reminded that only temporary/emergency repairs are allowed post-storm until the structure is inspected for "substantial damage" (damage in excess of 50% of the appraised value). Contact the Building Inspection Dept. for additional information.

Council Adopts 2023-24 Budget October 1 begins a new fiscal year for the Town of Dauphin Island and with it comes the need to develop and adopt an annual budget. The Town Council met in regular session on September 19 and unanimously approved a draft budget totaling \$8,064,750 which included pay raises for all employees and establishment of a \$1M reserve fund for future emergency needs. A copy of the approved budget is available on the town website for review. In addition, the council also approved an updated pay scale for all positions that should help attract and retain quality employees.
