**Council Establishes Parade Route Regulations** The Town Council recently took action that will change the way parade-goers prep for our 2023 Mardi Gras parades. Selection and/or reserving of spaces along the route will be limited to the day of event only (beginning at sunrise) and ropes, ribbons, and other similar materials are not allowed to mark areas. Vehicles, tents, lawn chairs and the like can be placed within the Bienville Blvd. medians and right-of-way but must be accompanied by an individual. This year, areas were roped off nearly two weeks in advance of the first parade and these items interfere with required maintenance activities, are unsightly, and can pose hazards to pedestrians and motorists. Items placed along the route should be removed at the conclusion of each parade or be subject to disposal during the post-parade cleanup process. We will re-evaluate these new measures following the 2023 parades and make any necessary changes to further improve the carnival season experience here on the island.

**Building Codes, Regulations, and More** Surveyors are the eyes for the building official, insurance agent and claims adjusters to name a few. Elevation certificates are signed and sealed by a professional surveyor attesting to the elevation of the home. Other information provided by the elevation certificate includes crawl space and details on storage areas under the footprint of the home and more. Compliance is key with the community's role in participating in the National Flood Insurance Program. Storage Areas/Enclosures require a building permit and must be properly vented to meet FEMA requirements. The flood opening requirements are intended to equalize hydrostatic forces (loads or pressure caused by standing or flowing water) on walls, preventing damage to or collapse of the building itself. To qualify as a bottom floor the area must be limited to parking, access and storage. A compliant enclosed area below the base flood elevation (area below the living floor) can be rendered non-compliant by installing features that are inconsistent with the limitations on uses. Examples of features not allowed below the base flood elevation include Appliances, Heating & Air Conditioning equipment, Ventilation, Ductwork, Plumbing Fixtures, Non-flood resistant materials, and more than the minimum electric service required to address life, safety, and electric code requirements for vehicle parking, building access, or storage. Such storage areas also require a building permit. Building without a permit can result in a homeowner being fined as this is a violation of building codes and the Town of Dauphin Island Flood Ordinance 55A. The permit helps the town with required FEMA compliance and allows the community to participate in the National Flood Insurance Program. Adequate and proper venting is another important feature of construction. For example, a minimum of two vents per enclosed area are required and must be installed on two different sides of the exterior walls. The bottom of the flood vent openings must not be higher than 12 inches above the adjacent grade. The top of the opening must be below the Base Flood Elevation (BFE). Homeowners, builders, and surveyors all have roles to play with a community's compliance with FEMA and the National Flood Insurance Program. Otherwise, communities can be placed on probation or be suspended from the program entirely if non-compliant structures remain in place. Building officials are here to assist with questions regarding these and other types of construction. Let us know how we can help you.

**East End Beach and Dune Restoration Project Update** The project team conducted field investigations in Fall 2021 including topographic and bathymetric surveys, cultural resource assessments, and geotechnical sampling. Coastal engineers and scientists are analyzing the data collected during the field investigations to move the project to 30% design over the next two months. The Town will apply for a USACE individual permit in approximately two months. The town and their project team encourages and welcomes questions and input at any time. We have had several one-on-one meetings and a public meeting to discuss this design with property owners. A public hearing (similar to the meeting recently held at the Shelby Bldg.) is planned for March 3 at 2pm at town hall for establishing the proposed mean high tide line. Construction of the project is estimated for 2023 assuming all funding, legal, and compliance requirements can be satisfactorily addressed. **Signs of the Times** It's that time again. Another election cycle is upon us and candidates seeking to fill a variety of seats are out in force looking for votes. Although the primary election isn't until May 24, political signs are already popping up all over the place. While you're encouraged to support the candidate(s) of your choice and participate in the election process, please remember that political signs are only allowed to be displayed within forty five (45) days prior to the election (approx. April 9) here on Dauphin Island. The Sign Ordinance also limits the size and quantity of signs per parcel (per candidate) and prohibits these types of signs from being placed within town right-of-ways. This way we can all participate in the political process and keep our community looking good at the same time!

**Marsh Restoration Project Beginning Soon** The Graveline Bay Marsh Restoration Project engineering, design and permitting phase has been completed by the project team. The final design includes the construction of 60-acres of marsh mounds that maximize marsh edge habitat for fish, crabs, shrimp, and other wildlife. The material to build the mounds will be dredged from a borrow site just north of Graveline Bay and west of the airport. Larger mounds will line the north side of the project area protecting the smaller marsh mounds to the south from the predominant north winds. The mounds will be planted with the same species of marsh plants currently at the site. Once the plants grow, these mounds will look much like the remaining marsh habitat with a mosaic of tidal creeks and ponds amongst marsh. The project team has been issued a Nation-Wide Permit 27: Aquatic Habitat Restoration, Enhancement, and Establishment Activities from the USACE (SAM-2020-01094). Construction will begin in Summer 2022 once a qualified marine contractor is secured and will take approximately four months to complete. Funding for the construction phase of the project (Phase II) is being provided by the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation Gulf Environmental Benefit Fund.
