News From Dauphin Island Heritage and Arts Council LAST FRIDAY ART NIGHT! July 28, 6-8PM Join us as we celebrate the arts! There will be an art demo by artist Kirsten Mallon, open mic with local musicians, and food & drinks. "LFAN" is open to the public. DIHAC is a non-profit charitable organization, and your donations at the event are needed to help pay the expenses. Thanks in advance! The children's classes listed below are free of charge to children living in DIHAC's nonprofit service area (Dauphin Island, Coden, Bayou La Batre, Grand Bay, Theodore, Irvington, St. Elmo). See costs for nonresidents associated with each class. Preschool Studio Arts with Professional Artist John Halliday Tuesdays August 1, 8, 15, & 22 - 10-11AM. Ages 3-5. John will teach students how to paint with watercolors, oil pastels, acrylics, and more. Spark creativity and encourage your child's artistic side with these fun classes! Limited to 8 students. A parent or guardian must accompany 3-year-olds during the classes. Cost: \$60 for nonresident students. Beginning Throwing on the Pottery Wheel with Professional Potter LeaAyn Shurley Thursdays August 3, 10, 17, & 24 - 12:30-2:30PM. Students will learn the basics of how to center, throw, and glaze clay. Cost" \$150 – all materials & firings provided. Sterling Stackable Rings with Vaughn Millner August 18 – 6-9PM. Using a small torch, students will learn to create two sterling, stackable, textured rings. Students will be introduced to soldering, tools, fueling and lighting the torch, and other basic metalsmithing techniques. Council Sets Public Hearing The Town Council will host a Public Hearing on Monday, July 31 at 430pm to receive comments on proposed changes to Ordinance 60-H and amending 60-G Roofing Requirements. The revised regulations would enhance building codes that would qualify under the Fortified Homes program, providing heightened protection and reduced insurance premiums. Note: To receive premium discounts property owners must contract with a licensed professional to certify Fortified construction. While property owner dues of \$150 annually are not mandatory, they do help provide funds for maintenance and improvements. Only with paid dues, do you receive a membership card. With this card are many benefits including free play at tennis courts, free admission to Isle Dauphine Beach for card holder and four guests, free admission to Pirates' Pool, discounts for food and shopping, health and beauty, entertainment, and services from many businesses on the island. Sea Lab Tidbits The newly renovated Alabama Aquarium at the Dauphin Island Sea Lab is open to visitors! The renovations include a deeper connection to current research conducted by the Dauphin Island Sea Lab faculty and students and a fresh perspective on the Alabama Watershed. The Aquarium reopened on Monday, July 10 with a ribbon cutting. Alabama State Representative Chip Brown and Dauphin Island Mayor Jeff Collier joined DISL Executive Director Dr. John Valentine, DISL Foundation Executive Director Helene Hassell, and Aquarium Educator Mendel Graeber to cut the ribbon. Zoning Ordinance Update The Town Council met recently to make what should be the final edits and revisions to the draft Zoning Ordinance in preparation for a Public Hearing. The group has held multiple meetings during this process and the next step will be to provide a clean copy for review by the general public and set a formal Public Meeting at an appropriate time. Currently, we anticipate hosting such a meeting prior to November 1. Proposed changes in the draft version of the Zoning Ordinance will be highlighted in red for ease of identification by the reader.

Short Term Rentals; It's the talk of the town! For more than a year the subject of short term rentals has worked its way into almost every topic of conversation. The original proposal submitted by the Planning Committee would phase out short term rentals (over a prescribed period of time) in what was considered "traditional residential neighborhoods" primarily on the island's east end while allowing similar rentals in other parts of the island to maintain business as usual. As you might imagine this idea generated a wide variety of reactions from residents and property owners and otherwise caused a stir of emotions on both/all sides of the issue. The Zoning Ordinance (which includes the proposed short term rental regulations) was subsequently approved by the Planning Commission and passed over to the Town Council for final approval. For the past 6-8 months the Council has held numerous meetings to review and revise the entire Zoning Ordinance in preparation for its presentation to the general public at a required Public Hearing prior to a vote of the Council itself. The current version of the document contains most of the original recommended short term rental regulations although it would not phase out units in certain portions of the island. Instead, rental property owners/managers would be required to adhere to enhanced regulations or be subject to fines, penalties, and loss of license for one year. Requirements currently in the draft proposal include (but not limited to); occupancy & parking limits, adherence to the "Good Neighbor Policy", identifying a local "point of contact" to respond promptly to calls/ complaints, etc. Note: The town has established a 24/7 Complaint Hotline 251-313-4019 to report issues related to rental properties or you can submit such reports online via the town website (click on Rental Hub). The Town Council recognizes and appreciates the tremendous amount of input we've received from interested parties regarding the broader Zoning Ordinance review process and, in particular, feedback specifically related to short term rentals. Our community will be stronger having had these healthy conversations!

USACE Pass Drury and Little Dauphin Island Update: The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) Mobile District has completed the National Environmental Protection Act (NEPA) analysis to repair the breach at Pass Drury. A contract will be awarded for construction in late June with construction anticipated to begin in Fall 2023. Construction is estimated to take approximately 60 days. The USACE, along with project partners, continue to evaluate the effectiveness of a permanent breach at Pass Drury as part of the restoration of Little Dauphin Island. Design of the permanent breach and restoration activities is scheduled to commence Summer 2023.

GOMESA Funding Announced Governor Kay Ivey selected Gulfquest Maritime Museum as the backdrop for announcing the latest round of GOMESA funding totaling more than \$67M and Mayor Jeff Collier was in attendance representing the Dauphin Island community. In the package, the Town of Dauphin Island received \$1,250,000 for West End Beach Nourishment Engineering Design & Planning while DI Water & Sewer received \$3,246,455 for a Water and Sewer Rehabilitation Project. Our sincere thanks to Governor Ivey and Commissioner Chris Blankenship for funding these critically important projects for our barrier island community! GOMESA funds come from offshore oil and gas industry revenues and are reinvested into the two coastal counties in Alabama; those most impacted by the industry itself.

Name That Beach! The town council recently solicited public input to assist with the official naming of two public beaches and the response was overwhelming. More than 60 individuals submitted a variety of catchy and creative names for consideration and we greatly appreciate the energetic participation. Keeping with the theme of beaches being named in part for their respective locations on the island (ex. East End Beach, West End Beach, etc.) the council selected "Middle Beach" (submitted by Greg Pennington, Irene Hawkins, and Brandi Perkins & Neal Horton) for the public beach next to Dauphin Island School and "Bienville Beach" (submitted by Christine Carll and Sharon Helm) for the new public beach access planned at Pirates Cove Street. Once again, we thank each of you for taking part in this process.
