East End Restoration Update The Town of Dauphin Island recently opened bids from qualified marine contractors for construction of the East End Beach and Dune Restoration Project. This project will restore and enhance the habitat of the East End by nourishing and expanding the 2015-16 beach project. It will also create new vegetated dune habitat and will include sand fencing that will contribute to future dune growth. The sand for the new beach will be dredged from a source 4.5 miles offshore by the marine contractor, Weeks Marine, who is expected to begin mobilizing in December. Construction is expected to last until spring or summer 2024. This project is being funded by grants through the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation Gulf Environmental Benefit Fund (NFWF GEBF), National Coastal Resilience Fund (NCRF) and by FEMA disaster-assistance funding. Community Center Update Work on the new Community Center is progressing at a fast pace with estimated completion sometime later this calendar year. Not only is construction ramping up but improvements including sound system, tables & chairs, kitchen equipment, and flooring is also moving forward. The building should serve our island community well for many years to come!

Town Creates ReportItDI Hotline For the past year the town has contracted with a company called Granicus to assist with the overall identification and management of rental properties here on the island. As part of its services, Granicus also provided a 24-hour hotline to receive reports/complaints specifically about rental units. While that system seemed to function well for rental property issues, we also saw the need for our citizens to have access to a broader reporting system that could serve as a clearinghouse for all matters of importance. The new 24-hour ReportItDI phone number is 251-372-4326 and should be used when reporting NON-EMERGENCY items. Please make note of this new temporary number. A permanent number will be forthcoming.

Mardi Gras, Already? Although good ol' St. Nick won't arrive on the island for almost another couple of months, it's never too early to look ahead to carnival season! The 2024 Mardi Gras parades will be here before we know it as this year's events will be held on January 13 (Krewe de la Dauphine) and January 20 (People's Parade), both with a 1pm start time. In fact, applications to participate in the People's Parade are available on the town's website (along with rules/regulations) so be sure & get yours in early. Deadline for entries is Jan. 12. Serving as Grand Marshal this year is "The Perky Pelicans"! Note: The Krewe of Salty Paws is Jan. 27 and the MISS Parade is Jan. 28.

Council Sets Public Hearings Two Public Hearings are scheduled for Monday, November 6 (prior to the Council Agenda Meeting) to receive comments on proposed changes to Ordinance 60H (an Ordinance adopting technical building codes and supplemental provisions) at 4pm and Ordinance 20 (an Ordinance adopting litter controls) at 430pm. The first revision aims to reverse the current use of OSB (Oriented Strand Board) as a roofing material for homes and other structures. The change would enhance the existing building codes and strengthen future construction methods. The proposed changes in Ordinance 20 would simply alter the length of time trash receptacles can remain roadside both prior to and following collection. The recommendation would allow 24 hours for each. The Public Hearings will be held in the council chambers.

Celebrate Christmas Dauphin Island Baptist Church will host an event to "Celebrate Christmas" as we focus on the theme of Emmanuel—God with us. The night of worship will feature guest artists from Samford University, DIBC's children's choir, and other local artists. Together they will present Christmas classics and recent hits such as "Names" and "Gratitude." The event is open to the public and will be held on December 17 at 6 pm. Post-storm Building Repair Process Although the 2023 hurricane season is be winding down, property owners are reminded that only temporary/emergency repairs are allowed post-storm until the structure is inspected for "substantial damage" (damage in excess of 50% of the appraised value). Contact the Building Inspection Dept. for additional information.

West End Bird Plan Update The Town of Dauphin Island and Mobile County are completing the development of the Dauphin Island West End Bird Conservation and Management Plan. Funding for this effort was provided by the Deepwater Horizon oil spill settlement through the Alabama Trustee Implementation Group. The Plan is intended to guide future implementation of management activities for the uninhabited West End area of the Island with the goal of protecting and increasing nesting bird populations while enhancing habitat quality and availability. A project update will be provided at the upcoming Dauphin Island Projects Informational Meeting on Nov. 9 from 6-8pm at DISL and the draft Plan will be released for public review and comment at the end of November. Please keep an eye on the Town's website and social media channels for the official release of the draft Plan.

Causeway Breakwater Project A Go Mobile County Commission will be constructing the Dauphin Island Causeway Shoreline Restoration project in the coming months. Three miles of the Causeway from Cedar Point to Bayfront Park will be getting added protection and habitat creation. Over the next six months (October through March) you will see access channels being dug and then 150,000 tons of rock being laid to form a segmented breakwater. This work will be completed from the water on large barges. All precautions are in place to avoid oyster reefs. In the spring/summer 2024, sediment will be placed behind these breakwaters to form marsh habitat. Any questions can be directed to Mobile County Environmental Services 251-574-3229.
