Their mission is to remove barriers to care, deliver quality integrated health care, and build a better community through recovery and connection. They have 34 beds available for Vets Recover Detox and a Residential Treatment Facility that offers interdisciplinary culturally competent, trauma-informed care, respite care, and peer support. Their representative is Master Chief (Retired) Jason Lewis or Office Manager Melissa. The third organization was the Mobile County Veterans Treatment Court whose mission is to enhance public safety and help United States Military Veterans by providing a judicially supervised regimen of substance use disorder and/or mental health treatment to justice-involved veterans with the goal of returning sober, law-abiding citizens to the community and thereby closing the "revolving door" to the criminal justice system. Elevation Certificates Needed As the town continues its efforts to collect Elevation Certificates (EC) for all structures within the community and maintain compliance with the NFIP, we want to thank those of you who responded promptly following written notification to provide such documentation. Unfortunately, we still have a lot of work to do so many homeowners should expect to hear from us over the coming weeks and months until this matter is complete. Most homeowners will likely have an EC in their possession and we simply need a copy for our files. Otherwise, a new EC will be needed asap. Town Announces Comprehensive Plan Review/Update Process The Town of Dauphin Island has been awarded a matching grant from the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources ALABAMA COASTAL AREA MANAGEMENT PROGRAM for updating our comprehensive plan. Much has occurred since 2013 when our current plan was adopted and we must update it in order to keep pace with the dramatic changes with demographics, economics, and the environment just to name a few. The Comprehensive Plan is the primary policy document that identifies where we are currently with regard to matters such as Population, Economy, Services, Housing, Transportation, Land Use, Natural and Historical Resources, Recreation, Community Facilities, and more. The plan then looks at the challenges ahead (typically up to 20 years), and creates a long-range strategy to guide growth and development within our community. Updating our Comprehensive Plan will require public engagement and involvement for community feedback, and analysis of data obtained to formulate future strategies and objectives to accomplish goals based on our shared values. We will seek public input and participation in a variety of ways including surveys, open-houses, workshops (that will all be open to the public), a dedicated web page, and establishing a steering committee consisting of residents, business owners, property owners, as well as elected and appointed officials. In the next few weeks, we will be taking the first steps of this important process by holding a kickoff event and assembling the steering committee. Note: The Comprehensive Plan is a policy document created and adopted by the Planning Commission. The Plan's authority is provided for in the Alabama Code § 11-52-8 through 11-52-10.
