TOWN COUNCIL MEETING
SEPTEMBER 20, 2022

The Town of Dauphin Island Town Council met in regular session at 6:00 pm on September 20, 2022 in the Council Chambers. Attorney Bob Campbell was in attendance. ZOOM and FACEBOOK were utilized to allow residents and other interested parties to safely participate.

Mayor Jeff Collier called the Council Meeting to order and invited all present to stand and repeat in unison the Lord's Prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States. Town Clerk Wanda Sandagger called roll. A record of the results is as follows:

A quorum having been achieved, action was taken on the following topics.

ADOPT PRELIMINARY AGENDA:

Gene Fox made a motion to add two items and approve the amended Preliminary Agenda for September 20, 2022 as the Official Agenda. Trey Alderman seconded and the motion was approved unanimously.

A motion was made by Trey Alderman to approve the two Public Hearings and Regular meeting minutes for September 6, 2022. Earle Connell seconded and the motion passed.

APPROVAL OF EXPENSES:

Clinton Collier made a motion to approve Volkert's quote for Salt Creek Bridge Inspection at \$6,124.00 to include two consecutive annual inspections. Earle Connell seconded and the motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS #2: 2022-2023 BUDGET/PAYSCALE

A motion was made by Earle Connell to table this item until after Executive Session. Trey Alderman seconded and the motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS #3: COMMUNITY CENTER BID

A motion was made by Trey Alderman to approve the bid of \$1,286,550.00 from Dorman and Associates for the construction of the Community Center. Clinton Collier seconded and the motion passed with the following roll call vote:

NEW BUSINESS #4: PIER ASSESSMENTS - EAST END & MIDDLE BEACH

A motion was made by Clinton Collier to approve moving forward with Moffatt & Nichol bidding out the East End pier for repairs. Earle Connell seconded and the motion passed.

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NEW BUSINESS #5: TURNOUT GEAR - JAMES HALE

A motion was made by Trey Alderman and seconded by Earle Connell to purchase requested turnout gear for PSO James Hale in the amount of \$4812.00. The motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS #6: POLICE CHIEF TRAINING

Trey Alderman made a motion to approve up to \$750 for lodging and meals for Chief Claw to attend training class in Montgomery on October 5-7. Clinton Collier seconded and the motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS #7: DJ ASPHALT \$7500 - CHENAULT AVE.

A motion was made by Clinton Collier to approve the DJ Asphalt invoice of \$7500 for the repairs/patch work at Chenault Avenue. Earle Connell seconded and the motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS #8: FELICIA DUBOSE - PERMANENT STATUS

Clinton Collier made a motion to approve Felicia Dubose as permanent status after completing her six month probation period. Earle Connell seconded and the motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS #9: DRIVEWAYS

A motion was made by Trey Alderman to no longer provide/install driveways, rock or pipe for any new construction due to expense to the town. Earle Connell seconded and the motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS #10: PUBLIC WORKS PURCHASE TRACTOR

Gene Fox made a motion to approve Public Works purchasing a tractor not to exceed the bid law. Earle Connell seconded and the motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS #11: ORDINANCE 106

A motion was made by Trey Alderman to set a Public Hearing October 17, 2022 at 4:00 pm to receive comments on Ordinance 106 - Seawalls. Earle Connell seconded and the motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS #12: SEAWALL MORATORIUM RESOLUTION 10052021

A motion was made by Trey Alderman to extend Resolution 10052021, a moratorium on seawalls, for an additional six months. Earle Connell seconded and the motion passed.

EXECUTIVE SESSION*

A motion was made by Trey Alderman and seconded by Earle Connell to enter into executive session to discuss good name of individuals. Town Attorney Bob Campbell stated in the open meeting that
