

DI Bridge Repairs Underway Contractors have started work on the DI Bridge rehabilitation project with completion anticipated by early 2029. Motorists should expect daily lane closures in the work zones including one-lane signalized flagging operations during closures. Drivers are urged to slow down (45mph) and follow posted signs. ALDOT appreciates everyone's patience and attention to safety while crews make these important improvements. Cost of repairs will exceed \$33M.

Parking Changes Coming As of December 1, 2025, parking regulations on Raphael Semmes, St. Stephens, Sam Houston, and Sehoy (south of Bienville Boulevard) will be limited to Dauphin Island Property Owners/Residents with town-issued decals ONLY. This decision was based on a variety of issues including; limited parking availability in these areas, increased demand on office staff issuing temporary permits, and the DIPOA no longer recognizing renters as "guests". Fortunately, the island is blessed with an abundance of public beaches to accommodate the need. Property owners and residents can purchase (\$5) parking decals at town hall. Must bring vehicle and registration along with proper ID.

Rental Property Safety Inspections Update Beginning January 1, 2026, safety inspections for all Short & Long-term rental properties must be performed by a licensed/certified professional (ex. Certified Alabama Home Inspector, Certified Safety Property Manager, Licensed General Contractor, Licensed Plumber/Mechanical/Electrical, etc.). A copy of the selected inspector's professional license or certificate must be submitted to the Rental License Dept. at town hall. All safety inspections will be valid for a period of three (3) years. These enhanced regulations will improve the overall safety and quality of rental properties on the island.

Public Safety Dept. Launches New Program The Town of Dauphin Island Public Safety Department is proud to announce its new "Community Event Safety Kiosk" program that is designed to enhance emergency preparedness and rapid response capabilities during public gatherings and community events throughout the island. These kiosks contain a fire extinguisher, Automated External Defibrillator (AED), and other life saving devices and resources. "This initiative represents another step forward in our ongoing mission to make Dauphin Island one of the safest communities on the Gulf coast," said Public Safety Supervisor Troy Gorlott. This project aligns with the town's broader commitment to community resilience, public education, and proactive emergency management. County Provides Worn Flag Retirement Box Do you have a worn, tattered, torn, or faded U.S. (or other) Flag? If so, stop by the town hall lobby and deposit it into the box for proper disposal. Flags should be folded respectfully before being placed into the container. The Mobile County Sheriff's Office will be responsible for proper disposal of worn flags. NOTE: A similar collection box is located at the Welcome Center and those flags are collected by members of the American Legion Post 250.

Congressman Barry Moore Offers Public Assistance The Town of Dauphin Island has partnered with Congressman Barry Moore's office to provide in-person assistance at town hall on the second Tuesday of each month from 9am-11am. A representative will be on hand to help citizens with federal agency issues related to IRS, SSA, VA, Passports, etc. and no appointment necessary. This new service will continue throughout 2025.

Banding Event Nets Variety of Birds Alabama Audubon recently held its Bird Banding event at the sanctuary which drew nearly 300 bird enthusiasts to witness the annual spectacle. During the event birds are carefully caught using mist nets, then gently extracted and placed in soft cloth bags to be transported to the banding station. There, they are weighed, measured, and aged before receiving a uniquely numbered band that allows researchers to track its movements through a database. It's a fascinating way for citizen scientists to contribute to conservation and learn more about these incredible migrants and their long journeys.

Mardi Gras 2026! It's never too early to think about the carnival season. Especially this year as it comes quite early. In fact, crowd favorite Krewe de la Dauphine will get the party started when they roll down Bienville Boulevard on Saturday, January 17 at 1pm with decorative floats, trailered bands, and much more. If standing on the sideline isn't your thing, make plans now to enter the ever-popular People's Parade taking place on January 24 at 1pm. An awesome and exhilarating experience you'll not soon forget! Contact town hall for additional details on how to enter a unit and pick up a copy of the parade rules. Note: Parking and placement of items along the parade route are limited to day-of-event. On January 31, parade fun goes to the dogs when the DI Chamber plays host to the Salty Paws Pet Parade at 10am. Finally, you'll definitely want to be here for the island's only nighttime Mardi Gras event when the Massacre Island Secret Society strolls through neighborhood streets on Sunday, February 1 at 6pm with lighted torches, decorative costumes, and creative units that celebrate the unique history of Dauphin Island. Make sure to mark your calendars and join us for these festive events as we kickoff the 2026 carnival season!

Middle Beach Parking & Access Improvement Project Work is now underway on the parking lot and beach access improvements at Middle Beach (next to DI School) and construction is scheduled to be complete prior to spring 2026. Drainage issues in front of DI Elementary School will also be addressed within this project. During this period the park will be closed to traffic (vehicles and pedestrians) and we encourage you to utilize one of three other Town-owned public beaches. A majority of the nearly \$2M cost for the project will be paid for with GOMESA funds (approx. \$1.7M) with the town potentially picking up the difference. Note: The Mobile County School Board and/or Mobile County may assist with funds specific to the repairs at the school entrance.
