Stargazing Event Planned The Town of Dauphin Island is excited to co-host a star gazing event with the Mobile Astronomical Society on April 6 at the East End Beach. We ask that participants arrive 30 minutes BEFORE dusk as headlights coming into the parking lot will ruin the sky for viewing. Please note this is a weather permitting event. If the sky is not clear the event will be rescheduled. There will be professional telescopes set up to look through and telescopes connected to cameras for viewing. The society will be providing amazing views of Jupiter, Saturn, Orion constellation with greater Orion Nebula, Andromeda Galaxy, Pleiades Star Cluster, and so much more! Please note the access road will close prior to dusk to prevent light pollution for this event, so it is very important to arrive on time!

It's Spring Cleaning Time As the weather warms and days get a bit longer, now is the perfect time to do some spring cleaning and sprucing up our properties. To help with these tasks, the town provides free use of dumpsters for residents/property owners every Friday & Saturday from 8am-noon. Let's all roll up our sleeves and keep our island looking good!

Gone to the Dogs! Everywhere you look these days you see people out with their pets enjoying island life. While our barrier island community prides itself in being dog friendly, it also expects pet owners to act responsibly at all times. That starts with ensuring your pets are properly restrained and/or leashed and that you clean up after your pet. Town Ordinance 81 encompasses the entire island and covers a wide variety of pet ownership guidelines to keep your furry friends healthy and safe and prevent them from becoming a nuisance when out in public. It's also important to always clean up after your pet. The town has installed stations throughout the island complete with plastic bags and trash receptacles to help with this task. Remember, dogs are NOT allowed on the island's far west end including West End Beach and points west as this is prime nesting habitat for threatened/endangered birds and sea turtles. So as you enjoy island life with your family and pets, please make sure you do so in a responsible manner. That way everybody wins!

New Restrooms Arriving Soon East End Beach and Middle Beach (next to DI School) will soon be home to new pre-fab concrete restrooms. The units will be delivered fully assembled and set into place at each of these public beach locations in advance of the busy summer season. Just the latest in a string of significant improvements being made by the town.

Plein Air Dauphin Island 2024 Fifty artists from the southeast region will be painting on location around the island and in the Bayou La Batre area, with fresh works for sale in the gallery throughout the weekend. Car Tag Renewals Made Easy How would you like to renew your car tags without ever leaving the island? A new partnership between the town and Mobile County License Commission has now made that possible! A self-service kiosk has been installed in the town hall lobby that allows you to quickly and conveniently renew vehicle tags (decals only) with ease. Available during regular business hours.

Let's Dance Beginner Line Dancing classes began on February 26 at 130pm at the St. Edmunds Center (821 Cadillac Avenue) and you're invited to join in on the fun! Classes will be held every other week. No charge...just a donation for the church to open it's doors to the community.

Construction Zones Aplenty Residents and visitors of Dauphin Island will be encountering active work zones throughout the island as a number of projects get underway in the coming weeks. The town council recently approved several bids including repairs and upgrades to the Bike Trail, multiple drainage improvements (3-way stop, Bienville Blvd. east near ferry ticket booth, Hernando @ Bienville, and more), and shoreline restoration and eco-tourism projects along Aloe Bay —west end of Desoto Avenue and Eldorado Street. Please drive with caution and/or avoid these areas during construction if possible.

East End Restoration Moving Along The long-awaited restoration of the easternmost mile of the island got underway nearly a month ago and the contractor is making tremendous progress despite challenging weather conditions and mechanical breakdowns. At the writing of this news the beach construction is near the Sandcastle/Surf Club Condominiums (and moving west) having started at the far east end of the island south of Fort Gaines! When complete the project will consist of more than 1.1 million cubic yards of beach quality sand (including strategically placed dunes), sand fencing, and coastal vegetation that will be planted later this summer. In the meantime, please keep off newly created dunes and planted areas.

DI Elementary News Congratulations to Mrs. Asti Weaver for being named DI Elementary Teacher of the Year! Mrs. Weaver teaches math & science to 4th & 5th Grade students. Spring Break (no school) is April 15-19. The DI Elementary Book Fair is scheduled for April 30-May 3 and children from the community are welcome to visit the Book Fair on May 2 from 9am-1pm!

Food Truck Program Tweaked For the past two years food trucks have been permitted to set up in Cadillac Square on Mondays & Tuesdays from March-October and that has proven to be quite popular with our residents and visitors alike. This year the council, in response to public input, is changing the food truck days to Mondays & Thursdays. As in the past only two trucks are allowed on any given day on a firstcome basis. Please make note of this change.
