Dauphin Island Art Trail The 11th Annual Dauphin Island Art Trail sponsored by the Dauphin Island Chamber of Commerce has taken on a new face this year. The event will be held in ONE location in historic Cadillac Square Park instead of being at individual businesses as in the past. This year, there will be FOUR categories: **Juried Arts, Crafts, Culinary Arts & Literary Arts**. DI Bridge Repairs Starting Soon ALDOT recently announced the DI Bridge major rehabilitation project will officially get underway on September 30 with completion anticipated by early 2029. Motorists should expect daily lane closures in the work zones including one-lane signalized flagging operations during closures. Drivers are urged to slow down and follow posted signs. ALDOT appreciates everyone's patience and attention to safety while crews make these important improvements. Cost of repairs will exceed \$33M.

Middle Beach Parking & Access Improvement Project Work will be getting underway soon on the planned parking lot and beach access improvements at Middle Beach (next to DI School) and construction is scheduled to be complete prior to spring 2026. Drainage issues in front of DI Elementary School will also be addressed within this project. During this period the park will be closed to traffic and we encourage you to utilize one of three other Town-owned public beaches. A majority of the nearly \$2M cost for the project will be paid for with GOMESA funds (approx. \$1.7M) with the town potentially picking up the difference. Note: The Mobile County School Board and/or Mobile County may assist with funds specific to the repairs supporting the school.

Update on Other Island Projects Here's the latest update on the status of multiple island projects; **East End Beach & Dune Restoration**- Construction Complete. Post-construction monitoring to continue through 2027. **DI Beach Nourishment (West End)**- Engineers continue working toward final project design while the permitting process moves forward and we await word on potential funding. **EPA Barrier Island Water Quality and Stormwater Management**- Currently eight (8) undeveloped parcels on the east end of the island have been acquired in support of wetland creation/protection measures. **Graveline Bay Marsh Restoration**- Construction complete. **Aloe Bay Living Shorelines**- Construction complete. Post-construction monitoring will continue through 2026. **USACE Programmatic Beneficial Use Permit**- A long-term programmatic permit for the beneficial use of sediments from USACE dredging activities is being pursued. The permit will ensure that the pending Memorandum of Agreement with the Corps can be implemented to sustain the many investments and improvements on and around our barrier island community. **Billy Goat Hole Boat Launch**- Work is ongoing to replace the boat ramps and finger piers while construction will start soon to create a new handicap ramp and install an elevator at the Concession Stand and restroom complex. Improvements to the parking area were completed about a year ago. **Christopher Blankenship Eco-tourism Area & Kayak Launch**- Construction Complete. **Taylor Harper Hiking & Biking Trail Improvements (East End to Pirates Cove St.)**- Construction Complete. **Aloe Bay Harbor Town** - Work to begin soon to replace seawall and construct an elevated boardwalk (Putt-Putt west to Patronas Park). Next phase expected to take place in mid to late 2026 and include streetscape improvements along Desoto Avenue from LeMoyné Drive west to Levert Street. **Wastewater Treatment Facility (DIWS)**- Work is now underway and construction could take 2+ years to complete.

Paving the Way Selected streets throughout the island will soon receive a new layer of asphalt thanks to our friends at Mobile County and the Pay-As-You-Go road program. The work is expected to take place sometime during the next 45-60 days and will include the following streets; DeSoto Avenue (LeMoyne to Key), Buchanan (Bienville to Conde), Chenault (Albright to Alvarado), Alvarado, Albright, and the following streets will only be paved between Bienville Blvd. and Cadillac Avenue including Pascagoula, Pelican, Penalver, Penicault, Pensacola, Perdido, Pirates Cove and Port Royal. Please avoid these areas when you see construction in progress.

County Provides Worn Flag Retirement Box Do you have a worn, tattered, torn, or faded U.S. (or other) Flag? If so, stop by the town hall lobby and deposit it into the box for proper disposal. Flags should be folded respectfully before being placed into the container. The Mobile County Sheriff's Office will be responsible for proper disposal of worn flags. NOTE: A similar collection box is located at the Welcome Center and those flags are collected by members of the American Legion Post 250.

Sunset Sizzle Coastal Cookoff CANCELED We regret to report the Sunset Sizzle Cookoff scheduled for October 5 featuring the "Best of Hall's Sausage" has been canceled due to a destructive fire at the factory. We wish Hall's the very best as they recover from the damage and hope to partner with them again in the future.

Congressman Barry Moore Offers Public Assistance The Town of Dauphin Island recently partnered with Congressman Barry Moore's office to provide in-person assistance at town hall on the second Tuesday of each month from 9am-11am. A representative will be on hand to help citizens with federal agency issues related to IRS, SSA, VA, Passports, etc. and no appointment necessary. This new service will continue throughout 2025.

Council Approves FY2025-26 Budgets The Town Council recently adopted FY2025-26 budgets totaling nearly \$9.6M including General Fund \$7,165,200 and Enterprise Fund (Parks & Rec) \$2,434,191. Top revenue producers include Lodging Tax (\$2.6M), Sales Tax (\$1.5M), Ad Valorem (\$900k) and Campground (\$850k) while Salaries (\$3.3M) make up the largest single combined expense. This year's budget includes an across-the-board pay increase of \$1 per hour for all full and part-time employees and also covers the anticipated health insurance premiums increase for 2026! Both budgets are available for review on the town's website.

News From the Fire Chief It is with great pleasure that I bring to you notification of our latest ISO score of 5. This is the first survey by ISO since 2015 which resulted in the same score. DI Fire & Rescue will host a public meeting at the Community Center (small room) on October 8 at 6pm to further explain the importance of this rating and what it means for our department and the town. Safety Tip of the Month; Use safe grilling practices. Do NOT cook under a house or on a porch! Keep all exits accessible for use, review your home fire plan with your family, and identify where your safe meeting space is located outdoors in case of an emergency.

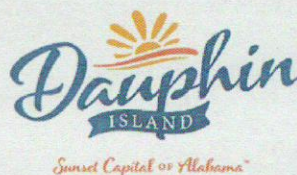
